What is Family PACT

1996 - California Legislature established Family PACT to provide *comprehensive clinical family planning and reproductive health services* at no cost to low income residents who are of reproductive age

1999 - CMS granted an 1115 Family Planning Medicaid Waiver

Comprehensive Family Planning

- Scope of services includes:
 - Family planning methods
 - Selected reproductive health conditions
- Delivered with client-centered education and counseling

Benefits Package

- Benefits package is organized into:
 - Primary family planning benefits
 - Secondary benefits for related reproductive health conditions
 - Services to manage pre-selected complications that may arise from the primary or secondary benefits services (these require an approved TAR)

Benefits: Primary Contraceptive Services

- Family planning method services, including periodic health screening and problem-oriented visits
 - E&M office visits
 - E&C office visits
 - Outpatient method-specific procedures
- Prescription contraceptives
- Emergency contraception
- Spermicides, male/female condoms, lubricants
- IUCs
- Contraceptive implants
- Sterilization

Benefits: Primary Contraceptive Services (cont'd.)

- Urine pregnancy testing
- Screening tests for breast and cervical cancer per policy
- Screening tests for specific STIs (Syphilis, HIV, Chlamydia, Gonorrhea) and their corresponding confirmatory tests
- Collection and handling of blood specimens
- Services for the management of complications arising from the use of a contraceptive method

Family Pact Primary Diagnosis S-codes

- Required for billing all program services
- Categories of S-codes relate to the family planning method selected by the client

Education & Counseling Visits Staff Abilities

- E & C may be offered by clinicians or by trained and supervised non-clinician staff
- Knowledge about reproductive health
 - Psychosocial and medical aspects
 - Behavior change and client-centered counseling
- Communication skills
- Recognize intense counseling needs
- Non-clinician counseling staff must be directly supervised onsite by a licensed practitioner

Individual family planning counseling: -Lasting up to 15 minutes -Provided by a clinician and/or counselor	Z9752: (May <u>not</u> be billed with E&M codes nor with Z9753 nor Z9754)	-Limited to two HCPCS Level III Interim office visits (Z9752-Z9754) per client, per 30 days, per provider. -Codes may be billed with Family PACT laboratory, surgical, medication and supply codes. -These codes may be used to report counseling issues, including lifestyle and relationship issues, method use and adherence, infertility, preconception counseling, pregnancy options and sexually transmitted infection (STI) prevention.
Individual family planning counseling: -Lasting 16 – 30 minutes -Provided by a clinician and/or counselor	Z9753: (May <u>not</u> be billed with E&M codes, nor with Z9752 or Z9754)	-Documentation requirements: Medical record documentation must support services claimed for reimbursement.
Individual family planning counseling: -Lasting 31 – 45 minutes -Provided by a clinician and/or counselor	Z9754: (May <u>not</u> be billed with E&M codes, nor with Z9752 or Z9753.)	-Documentation requirements: Medical record documentation must support services claimed for reimbursement.

Office Visit Codes Evaluation & Management Visits

- Family PACT E&M codes include:
 - 99201 – 99204 (new clients)
 - 99211 – 99214 (established clients)
- Family PACT defers to Medi-Cal policy regarding use of CPT, E&M and modifiers
- Use either time or the 3 “key components” (history, physical, medical decision making)
- A new patient has not been seen in your practice for at least 3 years

E&M or E&C Visit?

Code type	Code source	Provided by	Level computed by
E&M	CPT-4	Clinician, <u>with or without</u> Counselor services	Documented history, exam, and medical decision making OR Clinician and counselor time, if greater than 50 percent of total face-to-face time is spent in counseling
E&C	HCPCS	Clinician and/ or Counselor	Clinician and counselor time

Family PACT is Not...

- Family PACT is **not** a comprehensive primary care program
- Family PACT does **not** cover
 - Gynecologic evaluation or treatment for conditions *unrelated* to contraception or STIs
 - Pregnancy care
 - Abortion services
 - Infertility Dx and Tx, except fertility awareness
 - Diagnostic mammogram
 - HIV or hepatitis treatment
 - Hepatitis laboratory testing or vaccine
 - Services beyond stated FPACT benefits
