### Four Ways to Participate:

1. A few days before the conference, log on to <https://familypact.webex.com> to register online and gain an access code/toll-free phone number. If you need to set up WebEx on your computer for the first time, you should do this at least 5 days before the training. Then, on the day of the training, log on by 11:45 and view the presentation on your computer and listen on the phone.
2. For those without access to a computer at session time, log on to <https://familypact.webex.com> within one week prior to the training to download the presentation and get the toll-free phone number to call in. View your printed copy and listen on the phone on the day of the training.
3. For those without access to a computer, fill out the registration panel on this brochure and call 1-877-FAMPACT (1-877-326-7228) to have materials and a toll-free number sent to you to call in. View your printed copy and listen on the phone on the day of the training.

## Counseling Your Teen Clients About Long Acting Reversible Contraceptives

### Course Description

Research indicates that effective teen pregnancy prevention programs are those that focus on youth development principles. This session will demonstrate how incorporating youth development principles when counseling teens about long acting reversible contraceptives (LARCs) can enhance teen knowledge, perception, and use of LARCs. Topics discussed will include conveying to teens the links between using LARCs, delaying pregnancy, and achieving goals; informing teens about intrauterine contraceptives (IUCs) and contraceptive implants; and integrating dialogue on sexually transmitted infection (STI) prevention in teen LARC counseling.

### Objectives

As a result of this training, participants will be able to:

1. Discuss contraceptives in the context of youth development principles.
2. Explain the advantages of LARCs to teens.
3. Help teens prepare for likely side effects of LARCs.
4. Talk to teens about STI protection in addition to using LARCs.
